## SPRING EVENT

Invite a Master Gardener or well-known gardener to present on plants, such as native plants & pruning tips

Sponsor a community garden to support your food bank (use pics on media to show progression)

Work with a local nursery to purchase hanging baskets to sell to public or keep at your community

# EARTH DAY & ARBOR DAY

Coordinate with residents & local garden club to plant and sponsor a tree to give back to the local community

Feature local speakers on how to compost at your community.

Coordinate with local students on what they're doing to "go green" and connect across generations.

# MOTHER'S DAY TEA

Mother's Day Hanging Basket Sale (give a planting demo or have residents make baskets and sell them at event and donate proceeds to charity)
