- Game: Group similar shells together by color, size, ascending size, etc.
- If you live by the sea, watch and listen to the waves!

- Shells are the hard outer covering of some mollusks, such as snails, clams, and oysters.
- The shape, size, and color of shells can vary greatly depending on the species.
- Some shells are used as homes, while others are used for protection.
- Shells can be found in a variety of habitats, including the ocean, rivers, lakes, and even deserts.

- Hang wind chimes up and listen to their beautiful music.
- Look up in the sky and watch the clouds drift by.
- Watch the trees sway in the wind.
- Feel the breeze on your skin.

- Wind is the movement of air from areas of high pressure to areas of low pressure.
- Wind can be caused by differences in temperature, the rotation of the Earth, and the uneven heating of the Earth's surface by the sun.
- Wind can be used to generate electricity, power boats, and sail ships.
- Wind can also be used for recreation, such as flying a kite and windsurfing.
