***Chiricahua Leopard Frog***

- Both frogs and toads are beneficial to the garden because they feed on many pests such as, bugs, beetles, caterpillars, cutworms, grasshoppers, grubs, slugs, and a variety of other pests.
- A single frog can eat over 100 insects in one night.
- As tadpoles, they eat algae which helps to keep the water clean.
- Frogs are an important source of food for birds, fish and snakes and more.

***"Toad Abode"***

- **Install a Small Pond** with enough water for the eggs to remain out of direct sunlight and for tadpoles to swim around and eat water plants.
- **Create Shaded Sleeping Places:** The National Wildlife Federation suggests you invest in “toad abodes” to give them a few great hiding places. You can make one of your own by flipping a ceramic pot upside down and making sure it's angled enough to allow a toad to scramble in and out of it.
