



# LUCKY BAMBOO



***Plant Lucky Bamboo in odd numbered bundles. Even numbered bundles are considered bad luck. Five stalks represent the areas of life that impact wealth. Six stalks represent good luck and wealth. Seven stalks represent good health. Eight stalks represent growth. Nine stalks represent great luck.***

- Lucky Bamboo make great holiday gift plants because they thrive in low light and can survive for years in a pot filled with only pebbles and water, but fertilize to keep them longer & happier.
- According to Chinese folklore, anyone who receives a bamboo as a New Year's gift will have good fortune and prosperity for at least the following year.
- Tying golden or red ribbon around the Lucky Bamboo symbolizes additional good fortune.



# BASIL



- Basil is one of the most known and loved plants, and is used in foods during the Lunar New Year.
- It is said that those who keep a basil leaf in their wallet will benefit from luck when it comes to money, and if you plant basil outside around the house, any forces of evil will not come near.
- It is believed that basil offers protection and attracts luck and wealth, thus makes a great housewarming gift!



# THE MONEY TREE (PACHIRA SPP.)



- Pachira is one of the most famous plants in Feng-Shui. It is called the “money tree” or “good luck tree”.
- If it is placed in the south-eastern part of the house, it is believed that your family will never have problems with money, because Pachira would radiate great energy of prosperity from the southeast.
- Pachira is also very easy to care for: it is an indoor plant, and it requires a little watering only once a week to keep the soil semi-wet.



# SWEET ORANGE TREE (CITRUS SINENSIS)



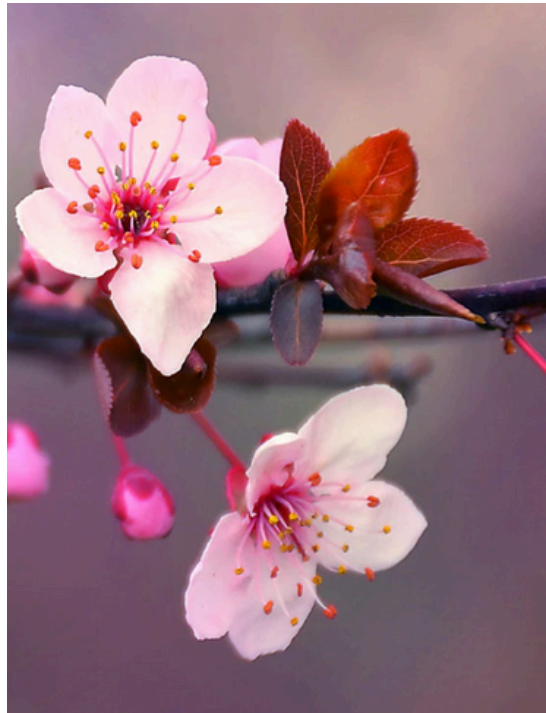
- The sweet orange tree is one of the favorite trees during this festive season.
